JUDGES MEETING :

If you are interested in learning to be a Judge or
how to correctly write up result sheets or cards, a
meeting will be held at 7.30pm at the South Brighton
Community Hall on the last Monday of the Month.

After welcoming members to the afternoon meeting and giving a run-down of coming events, Keith Northcote took us on a visit to the Bronson Orchid Gardens in South-Eastern Queensland. Keith explained the lay-out and then showed slides - firstly of the waters of Moreton Bay lapping the front lawn and then around the garden itself. The garden has been developed, and re-developed during the past 20 years, so it is at varying stages. There are many palms, and pots made from hollow logs are set between these in a pine bark mix. Spanish moss is used as a protection for the young orchids. Companion planting is a feature with Vandas and Bromeliads happily growing side by side. Epidendrums are a feature throughout and multi plantings in large pots give variety. Well worth a visit. Keith's Cattleya Valentine Day 'Cardinal Velvet' received the first choice of the plants on show followed by Ralph Barrett's species *Catasetum russellianum* and Peter and Leslie Fenton's Epidendrum Boundii. The usual raffle of plants was followed by a cuppa and a chat.

SHOW NOTES

The Exhibitor's Show Rules are printed later on in this Gazette, however, there are a few other items that need to be brought to Members' attention.

1. Your Show Number is on the label on the front of this Gazette.
 2. A Seedling shall mean the complete plant grown from seed and flowering for the first time. For exhibition purposes seedlings shall retain their status of seedling throughout the flowering season in which they first flowered.
 3. Staked Cymbidiums may have only 1 tie above the bottom flower for showing.
 3. Staked Cattleyas and Paphiopedilums may only be tied below the ovary.
- Plants that are tied incorrectly will be **downgraded and possibly disqualified**. Any questions on the above please see the Registrar at the next Cultural Meeting.

EXHIBITORS SHOW RULES

- All exhibitors must be financial members of the South Coast Orchid Club of South Australia Incorporated.
- Entries are free.
- Exhibitors are bound by the Constitution, Rules and By-Laws & Special Show Rules of the Club.
- The opinion of the Judges is final & binding & no objections or discussion regarding results will be considered. There is one exception & that is an infringement by an exhibitor of any of the Club's Laws, By-Laws, or Show Rules. Any objection in this case must be lodged with the Show Marshall.
- The Club accepts no responsibility for any loss, damage or infection suffered by any plant or blooms exhibited.
- The Club reserves the right to photograph any of the exhibit if it should wish.
- In all matters regarding the arrangement & conducting of the Show, with the exception of matters pertaining to the judging, the Show Marshall is the ruling authority.
- No plant suspected by the Club's 'Virus Adjudicators' of being infected with virus will be eligible for competition & such plant(s) will be completely isolated from all other plants.

9. The exhibition area will be closed during judging. No exhibitors, public or member other than the Show Marshall, Registrar of Judges, Judges & Associate Judges of the Club & other persons so appointed as to assist with the judging will be allowed to remain in the exhibition area during this period.
10. Non-exhibitors are requested not to congregate in the exhibition area prior to judging so that Officials can arrange plants & perform other necessary duties unhindered.
11. Plants must be labelled with the coloured labels provided by the Club with exhibitor's number & name of plant. Supply of these labels can be obtained from the Show Marshall or his nominee.
12. Exhibitors are to ensure that all labelling be neatly & correctly performed in accordance with the procedure laid down on Orchid Nomenclature & Registration. Labelling shall be legible from a reasonable distance.
13. All exhibits must be benched as directed by the Show Marshall.
14. Exhibits must be removed & the area cleaned as directed by the Show Marshall.
15. Exhibitors unable to remove their own plants from the Show should provide the person doing so with a letter of authorisation.
16. Damage caused in transit to the Show should be reported to the Show Marshall or Registrar of Judges prior to the commencement of Judging.
17. **If in the opinion of the Judge, a plant is not worthy of an award or prize in any specified section, then none shall be given.**

Please note: That in accordance with Club By-law 3(i) the following applies 'At all shows, meetings or special judgings, an exhibitor shall accept full responsibility for the safety and well-being of his plants and inflorescences and shall indemnify the Club and its judges against loss theft and damage of any kind to his plants or inflorescences.'
