South Coast Species March meeting

13 members met for the first meeting of the species society on Monday 2nd March. It was good to see some new attendees at this meeting including a couple from Victor Harbor. At this time of the year there is not a great deal in flower but members managed to bench eight plants of various genera varying in size and floriferousness. There was a large plant of *Brassia longissima* one of about 30 species in the genus from tropical America. Most are easy to grow and flower in South Australia. They prefer a free draining mix in pots or baskets in intermediate temperatures with regular watering in the growing season and kept on the dry side in the cooler months. All the species produce large spidery flowers in shades of yellow and green. A genus well worth growing in a mixed collection.

Another attractive species benched was *Maxillaria cucullata* this is one of the many mainly yellow species from the genus of about 300 species spread across the Americas from Florida in the USA to Argentina in South America. Many of the species are very similar in shape and colour and unfortunately many in collections have been misnamed, any yellow Maxillaria seems to be given the name *Maxillaria picta* that is the most common of the species in cultivation. Species from this genus, in the main, are easy to grow and flower requiring bright light, but not full sun, as the strap like leaves burn easily. Intermediate conditions seem to suit them best although with such a large genus this is only a general rule. Those that do not have pseudobulbs must be kept moist, not wet throughout the year, those with pseudobulbs require a short dry rest after the bulbs mature. Careful attention must be paid when repotting as some of the species resent being disturbed and can take a long time to recover.



Not many species are native to Japan one notable exception is *Neofinetia falcata*. This delightful little monotypic (meaning one only) genus resembles a miniature Angraecum having long 40mm nectaries on pure white flowers. The Japanese revere these plants and even grow them for the foliage alone many of which are variegated. It is not a difficult species to grow producing its very fragrant flowers from the base of the fan of leaves, when not in flower the plant looks like *Sarcophilus ceciliae*.

Other species benched were *Phalaenopsis amboinesis*, *Phalaenopsis falcata*, *Stelis* sp, *Pleurothallis luteola*, *Restrepia pelix*.

After the plants were passed around the table and discussed Ron gave a very interesting power point presentation of some of the 300 species of the genus Maxillaria followed by a cup of tea or coffee and socialising.

March 2009 Benched Plant Commentary

Flower of Open Division and flower of the night: *Stanhopea (Stan.) wardii* grown by Richard and Beryl Wilson. Two inflorescences protruding down through the sphagnum moss lined hanging basket in which the plant was grown. Each spike had 5 flowers, one fully open and the other still in bud. Flowers were 90mm across and 75mm tall with deep yellow sepals and petals with fine even light purple spotting. The broad sepals were flattish giving the flowers the appearance of flying birds; the narrower petals were frilled along the edges and curved back between the sepals. The labellum is complex and coloured different shades of yellow.



Flower of First Division: *C. loddigesii* grown by Rito Silvestri. A species from South America originally collected from the region around Rio de Janeiro. A well grown plant with upright canes of varying sizes carrying 1, 3 and 4 flowers 80mm wide by 90mm tall. Sepals and petals lavender pink with the same colour column and labellum side lobes, the flat mid-lobe being a vibrant purple.



Flower of Second Division: *Lc. Janet* benched by Anne and Colin Campbell. A well grown plant with each cane larger than the previous one, the two latest canes bearing inflorescences of one and three flowers 115mm in both dimensions. The flowers were 'non-standard' with narrow sepals and slightly broader petals. Sepals and petals deep lavender pink, the labellum purple with a cream base.



A few other plants benched:

Onc. Sharry Baby benched by Wendy Lodge. A single tall inflorescence with seven short side branches up the stem bearing flowers 30 mm wide and 40mm tall. Deep maroon sepals and petals finely edged with cream, the labellum in the shape of a 'small doll' with deep pink-maroon upper half and some white markings and a white 'skirt' (central lobe) with maroon markings down the centre line.



Paph. [(Fairy x Lien) x Maud Magic] benched by Irene and Ron Parish.

A progressive flowerer 45mm from petal tip to petal tip and 80mm tall. Dorsal sepal white at the tip shading to light green at the base, finely striped in green and purple and a light overlay in the central region. Petals narrow, light green with fine deep purple stripes and edges lightly frilled and with many hairs along the edges. The labellum was green at the centre of the flower shading to light purple at its base. The ventral sepal was green striped.
