The next Monthly Meeting of the Club will be held at the Lutheran Church Hall, Windsong Court, Christies Downs on TUESDAY NOVEMBER 11 at 8 P M.

PROGRAMME

The Registrar of Judges, Mr Harry Lambert will speak on the subject of Judging of Cymbidiums - Standards, Export, Decorative and Novelty and Miniatures.

On most prize schedules whether it be Winter or Spring Show, prizes are given for the best exhibit in each of the above categories. The purpose of this programme is to make each Member better informed on exactly what the Judges are looking for. Controversary often exists as to the difference between a Novelty and a Miniature Cymbidium. It is felt that this programme will be of considerable benefit to members in the selection of plants to purchase in readiness for 1981 competitions.

MONTHLY PLANT COMPETITION

The November meeting concludes the 1980 plant competition. There will be no benching of plants in December.

NOMINATIONS FOR OFFICE BEARERS AND COMMITTEE - 1981

Members are reminded that nominations for the Committee of Management will be called for at the December meeting. Now is the time to give thought to this important matter.

SPRING SHOW 1980

I have been asked to comment on our Spring Show at the November meeting but rather than take up valuable time at the meeting I have decided to to submit a report thus enabling members to read same in leisure (!) time and hopefully comment to Committee on any aspects which they feel would improve this activity in the future.

MOSS GATHERING Members met at the "traditional" meeting place (Morphett Vale Hotel) and despite early rain a profitable and enjoyable day was had by all who attenced. Those not able to participate on the "scheduled" day arranged a gathering on the following Sunday. A member has suggested that for some a more convenient place to meet would be the Victoria Hotel thus saving considerable mileage.

PLANNING The planning of the displays had the following objectives:-

- to take advantage of natural light.
- to secure maximum prominence in main promotion areas.
- to enable viewing from both "upper" and "lower" levels.
- the size of the exhibits was planned to accommadate fencing of 10 feet lengths to give security with a 2 foot claerance.

NUMBER OF ENTRIES Initially 12 entries were provided for but this increased to 15 and an overflow for composite was necessary. The need to create extra display area greatly improved the ultimate total layout.

HELP BY MEMBERS Many members not arranging exhibits of their own helped in various ways both in arranging and clearing up and their activity was much appreciated - particularly in clearing up.

TRANSPORT most members were able to provide their own transport of plants but where necessary the Club gave assistance in conveying plants etc for display purposes.

ARRANGING OF EXHIBITS Access both by (1) Use of loading bay and (2) through main entrance doors was adequate and generally there were no problems associated with the arranging.

JUDGING Our Registrar of Judges, Harry Lambert, ably assisted by a willing team did a magnificent job in a limited period of time and all are both to be congratulated and thanked. It would be a great help to Judges if when 2 or more members enter an exhibit they be in the same Division and exhibits were to be grouped accordingly.

THE OPENING Our Patron, Mr H W Hunt, Mayor of Noarlunga, opened our

Spring Show and presented major prizes. Mrs Hunt; Colonnades Manager Mr Don Hawking; and Promotions Manager Mrs Kay Schmidt also presented major prizes. The ceremony was followed by a much appreciated afternoon tea provided by Colonnades. The opening was well attended by members.

RESULT SHEETS Members are already in possession of result sheets and no further comment is necessary. Three suggestions have been made:—
(1) Review or major prizes, (2) Review of Display prizes, (3) introduction of a prize for "best group of three" in Cymbidium section.

COMMENTS ON DISPIAYS Many complimentary comments were made by both orchid growers and others and these comments can be summed up in the

words of one person who stated broadly that the plants were of high standard and well displayed. A suggestion has been made that displays be sprayed daily to maintain freshness. This has merit.

THE THEME The theme was well presented. However some exhibits did not present the theme and a request has been made that in future no "exhibitors award" be made to those exhibitors who do not support the theme.

RANGE OF GENERA Standard cymbidiums understandably were the major genera presented but nevertheless there was also a reasonable showing of Australian Natives together with other miscellaneous genera of various types. Can we improve?

FLORAL ART The Floral Art section was well supported and exhibits contributed to the decoration of a birthday "cake."

PROMOTION Coinciding with the anniversary of the opening of Colonnades our Spring Show was extensively advertised in the "Advertiser", Messenger Press, over radio and "our Lois" represented the Club on Channel 10 - a Touch of Elegance. Promotion of the Club was achieved by leaflets and bill-boards.

SIGNAGE All exhibits were uniformingly identified by "Exhibitors name plates" professionally executed and to the Club Member who was responsible for these and the bill-boards our thanks.

TRADING Corsages were sold and likewise plants. The plant sales reached an unexpected high. Potting demonstrations were given - including one involving an "old man" cymbidium supplied by Bernie Hansen from which 22 divisions resulted.

Some Members have indicated an interest in arranging small displayes of their own for the first time and their needs can easily be met by suitable planning. Be encouraged - check your plants now as to quantity and floering time - collect bits and pieces of support foliage and you will be rewarded. Don't panic Floral Art members - there is plenty of room.

APPRECIATION In conclusion we place on record our appreciation of the support of the Colonnades Merchants Association, of Colonnades Management and all our friends at Colonnades whomcontributed in many ways.

VIRUS INVESTIGATION

Results were made known individually to those members who sent in specimens of orchids leaves etc., that proved to be positive. In all 33 specimens were sent to Professor Zettler, 18 of these proved to be positive. Odontoglossum ring spot virus accounted for 17 of these, and cymbidium mosiac virus for the other one. Fifteen specimens were clear of virus.

Floral Art

HOME WORK

A line arrangement emphasing good balance andrhythm.

DEMONSTRATION

Suitability of background material to container.

WORK IN CLASS

In this we will follow on from last month so bring along any container and material suitable for a Modern arrangement. As the emphasis will still be on balance and rhythm here are a few notes to help you to understandrhythm more fully.

RHYTHM

Rhythm is a feeling of motion or movement in an arrangement; the eye should glide easily from one point to another. This can be achieved by good line direction and the correct use of solids and voids. Repetition, with graduation of forms such as circles etc., by lengthening or shortening lines or curves will also give a feeling of rhythm.
