


HAPPY NEW YEAR

AWARDS

Further on in this Gazette you will see that Pam and John Beasley's *Oncidium sphacelatum* has been awarded a Highly Commended Certificate.

At this point in time in order to qualify for a H.C.C. a plant must meet the following two criteria:-

- (1) The average of the total points allotted by the Judges must not be less than 75 points out of a possible 100.
- (2) The plant must receive an average of not less than 75% of the points available for Shape and must receive an average of not less than 75% of points available for colour.

All these details are set out in The Australian Orchid Council's little book called STAN-DARDS FOR JUDGING.



FLOWER OF THE DIVISION:
Paphiopedilum lawrencianum grown by Ron & Irene Parish

Paphiopedilum lawrencianum is native to Sarawak and Sabah in Northeastern Borneo and was first discov-

ered in 1878.

It is popular with hybridists and has been crossed with other species including *delenatii*, *praestans*, and *purpuratum* to name a few and also the with some of the more advanced hybrids including Saint Swithin and Vintner's Treasure.



Paph. lawrenceamum usually only has the one beautiful flower per flowering stem. The dorsal sepal is white with purple or green and purple stripes. This along with the prominent purple warts on the petals makes it a rather eyecatching species to have in your collection.
