EXHIBITORS' RULES FOR SHOWS

1. All exhibitors must be financial members of the South Coast Orchid Club of South Australia Incorporated.
2. Entries are free.
3. Exhibitors are bound by the constitution, Rules, By-Laws and Special Show Rules of the Club.
4. The opinion of the judges is final and binding and no objections or discussions regarding results will be considered, with one exception, which is an infringement by an Exhibitor of any of the Club's Rules, By-Laws or Show Rules. Any objection in this case must be lodged with the Club Show Marshall/Secretary.
5. The Club accepts no responsibility for any loss, damage or infection suffered by any plant or blooms exhibited.
6. The Club reserves the right to photograph any of the exhibits if it should so wish.
7. In all matters regarding the arrangement and conduct of the show (with the exception of judging) the Show Marshall/Secretary is the ruling Authority.
8. No plants suspected by the Club Virus adjudicators of being infected with virus will be eligible for competition and such plants will be completely isolated from all other plants.
9. The exhibition areas will be closed during the judging. No exhibitors, the public or members other than the Show Marshall/Secretary, Judges of the Club, Associate Judges and other persons appointed to assist in judging will be allowed to remain in the exhibition area during this period.
10. Non-exhibitors are requested not to congregate in the exhibition area prior to judging so that officials can arrange plants and perform other necessary duties unhindered.
11. Plants must be labelled with the coloured labels provided by the Club with the exhibitor's number and name of plant. These are available from the Show Marshall/Secretary or his/her nominee.
12. Exhibitors are to ensure that all labelling be neatly and correctly performed in accordance with the procedure laid down on orchid Nomenclature and Registration.
13. All plants benched for judging at the show must be made available to be in the club display for the show week.
14. All exhibits must be benched by the nominated time on the nominated day for judging. The nominated day and time will be published in the Club gazette in the month prior to the Show.
15. Exhibits must not be removed before nominated time on the nominated day at the end of the Display week. The nominated day and time will be published in the Club gazette in the month prior to the Show.
16. Exhibitors unable to remove their own plants from the show should provide the person so doing with a letter of authorization.
17. Damage caused in transit to the show should be reported to the Show Marshall/secretary or Registrar of Judges prior to judging.
18. If, in the opinion of the judges, a plant is not worthy of an award or prize in any specified section, then none shall be given.

August Plant Commentary

Flower of First Division and Flower of the Night: *Paph. Chouvetii* 'Van Dyke' benched by Rod and Judy McRedmond. A well grown plant bearing two glistening flowers 100 mm. tall by 115 mm. wide. The upright dorsal sepal curved over at the upper end, the dorsal being white. The petals were around the edge, green towards the midline with brown spotting becoming almost solid along the line of the vein. The petals were deep brown on the upper half, the lower half being light green overlaid light brown with some brown spotting. The labellum was brown on light green with yellow-green around the opening.



August Plant Commentary (cont.)

Flower of Open Division: *C. percivaliana* 'Summit' benched by Richard and Beryl Wilson. The flowers were 120mm. Tall by 105mm. wide with two flowers per inflorescence. The sepals and petals were lavender pink, the labellum was a similar colour around the edge with a big patch of deep purple on the mid-lobe and deep patch of orange behind it. There were fine purple lines overlaid on the orange and the side-lobes curled up over the column and was also light purple



Flower of Second Division: *Cym. Willunga Magic* 'Midnight' benched by Vicky Cooper. A mature plant, well grown and bearing four inflorescences with open flowers and another two in bud. The four open inflorescences carried 21, 21, 18 and 18 flowers, all open. Sepals and Petals were very deep maroon, the labellum was white/pale pink around the frilled edge then behind the edge heavy deep maroon markings shading to pink with cream/yellow in the throat (base of the labellum). The column was also deep maroon.

Grand Champion, Champion First Division and Champion Paphiopedilum:

Paph. chouvetii 'van Dyke' benched by Rod and Judy McRedmond.

A well grown plant with two well displayed flowers on individual stems. Green dorsal sepal, white edge with reddish brown spots becoming denser towards the centreline and green vertical sepal. Upper half of the petals were light red/brown, midline vein was deep solid maroon and the lower halves of the petals light brown over green background. The labellum was red/brown and lighter inside pouch with a very fine green line around the labellum opening.

Champion Open Division, Champion Australian Native and Champion Specimen:

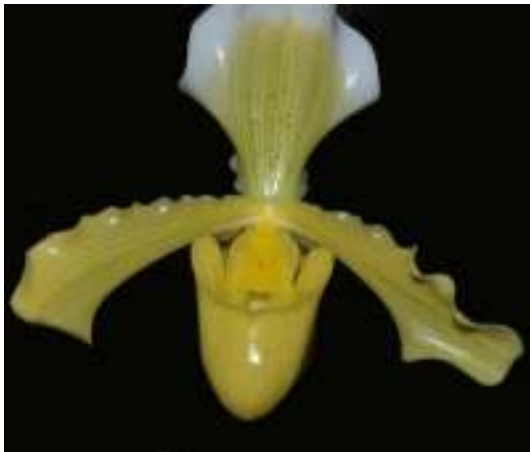
A large plant with numerous inflorescences bearing up to at least nine flowers. The yellow sepals and petals were edged with red markings. The labellum was red with a yellow stripe along the midline and a pale cream column.



Champion Second Division and Champion Species:

Paph. insigne var *Sanderæ* benched by Oui Ju & Michael Willoughby.

A large well grown species plant with three flowers on individual stems. The dorsal sepal was pale green with a small amount of light brown spotting and upper third was white. The ventral sepal was yellow with a fine green tinge and the labellum was all over yellow with a deeper yellow disk at the centre of the flower



Champion Cymbidium over 90mm:

Cym., Khan Flame 'Tuscany' benched by Denis and Glenys Cook.

A plant with a showy single inflorescence 100mm. tall by 100mm. wide. Sepals and petals were deep red and the labellum had a fine white edge and deep maroon heavy barring and spotting on white towards the centre. The column was crimson with a white pollen cap.

Champion Cymbidium 60-90mm:

Cym. One Tree Hill 'Solstice Gold' benched by Denis and Glenys Cook.

A large plant with seven inflorescences with from eight to sixteen open flowers and one inflorescence still to open. The flower's sepals and petals were yellow with a greenish tinge. Labellums were cream with heavy crimson on the mid-lobe.

Winter Show Plant Commentary (cont.)

Champion Cymbidium <60mm:

Cym. Sarah Jean 'Red Nelly' benched by Oui Ju & Michael Willoughby.

The plant displayed five inflorescences with fully open flowers, one partly open and one still in bud. Sepals and petals were medium/deep pink with a deeper central stripe. The white labellum had the central section crimson with the edge being a fine white line. The column was white to pale pink, shading to deep red at the tip with a white pollen cap.

Champion Laeliinae:

Ctt. Scarlet Imp 'Monica' benched by Richard and Beryl Wilson.

A plant with two inflorescences of sixteen and fourteen flowers plus two buds. Sepals were deep orange, the petals similar but just a little lighter. Flowers were arranged around the stem. The labellum was yellow with red around the edge of the mid-lobe.

Champion Phalaenopsis:

Phal. Henry Song benched by Henk and Erna Van Leuven.

A plant with a single branching inflorescence with twelve open flowers on the main stem and three branches with at least ten buds still to open. Sepals and petals very pale green overlaid with heavy crimson/red 'netting' on the upper side. Flowers had a solid deep maroon labellum and the maroon column had a white pollen cap.

Champion Zygotepalum:

Zga. Adelaide Meadows 'Pyzar' benched by Kevin Trevan.

A plant with two inflorescences from the one lead, each stem carrying four flowers. Flowers were very flat, sepals and petals solid green with some spots and barring along the mid-line. The showy white labellum had fine linear purple markings near the flower's centre. The red/brown column had a yellow pollen cap.

Champion Oncidiinae:

Onc. Tsiku Marguerite benched by Eileen Pinnock.

A well grown Plant in approximately a 100mm. pot with some seventeen inflorescences, each bearing many flowers. The sepals and Petals were pale pink. The mid-lobe of the labellum was white with yellow towards the flower's centres.

Champion Dendrobium (other than Australian Native):

Den. (teretifolia x fuliginosa) benched by George Misirlis (1125)

Some ten to eleven inflorescences on a relatively small plant mounted on a fern slab. Flowers hang down (upside down). Sepals and petals were pale cream/white. The labellum curls up and has fine coloured markings.

Champion Seedling:

Cym. tracyanum benched by Paul and Donya Hayes.

Typical form for the species with somewhat narrow spidery sepals and petals with heavy spotting along the veins making parallel stripes. The Labellum curls under, is white, but many small red spots add colour to it. The column is cream with crimson marking and it has a white pollen cap.

Champion Other Gerera not otherwise listed:

Ansellia Africana benched by Wendy Lodge.

A large well grown plant with numerous flowers on four branching spikes. Sepals and petals were light greenish yellow. The flowers were 40mm. tall by 40mm wide. The labellum was yellow and the column was green/cream topped with a pale pollen cap.
