### AUSTRALIAN EPIPHYTIC ORCHIDS

Some notes on the plants we have seen on the bench lately :-

(1) *Dendrobium* xdelicatum = *D.kingianum* x *D.speciosum*  
This hybrid is extremely variable. Considering how varied the two parent species are, it would be expected that the same would apply to their progeny, according to Wally Upton. With the few xdelicatum plants that we have in our collection there are plants that have typical *D.speciosum* growth whilst others are *D.kingianum*. The pseudobulbs could be up to 55cm long but are commonly about 35cm long. The majority of the growths however, seem to be 'large *D.kingianum*', usually topped by 3 or 4 leaves. The flowers are mostly *D.kingianum* shape, between 20 and 30mm in diameter, but vary in color from white thru pink, mauve, with white thru pink-mauve labellum. Racemes carry up to 20 blooms however some flowers hardly open at all whilst others open widely.

(2) *Dendrobium* xsuffusum = *D.kingianum* x *D.gracilicaule* (*D. macropus* subsp.*gracilicaule*)  
The pseudobulbs may be up to 40cm tall however, the plant in our collection has growths nearer 20cm. This is probably due to the shorter -stemmed *D.kingianum* being used. Between 3 - 7 leaves usually top the pseudobulbs. The flower color is variable from white- deep cream on the inside of the segments thru to pale mauve - purple on the outside. (*D. kingianum* is dominant in the suffused markings.) The shape of the flower is similar to *D.kingianum*.

(3) *Dendrobium* Hilda Poxon = *D. speciosum* x *D. tetragonum*. This hybrid is rather large and spidery with the flower number being halfway between the two species. The flowers are usually a creamy-yellow and may be with or without spots. According to an article in Orchids Australia October 1989, 'The vigour, large flower count, long racemes and erect plant habit of *D. speciosum* combined with the large yellow starry flowers and habit of flowering over a long period by *D. tetragonum* produced a hybrid of outstanding quality. The influence of *D. tetragonum* has meant that Hilda Poxon has a varied flowering season and may flower several times a year.

(4) *Dendrobium* Bardo Rose = *D. falcorostrum* x *D. kingianum*. According to Rentoul this was among the first cross-pollinations. The flowers are generally white to pink, larger than *D. kingianum* , more open and 'meatier'. *D. kingianum* tends to pull down the size of the plant of whatever it is crossed with,

but usually produces a free-flowering, medium-sized plant.

**(5) Dendrobium Colin**

= *D. Ellen* (*D.kingianum* x *D.tetragonum*) x *D. jonesii*(*ruppianum*). Both *kingianum* & *tetragonum* are considered to be dominant species whilst *D. jonesii* is not. Upton considers *D. Colin* to have *D. falcorostrum/D.speciosum/D.jonesii* shape. Once again depending upon the cultivar used *jonesii* may have been used to increase floriferousness and size, or broaden the mid-lobe of the lip. Colin looks similar to Ellen i.e. usually pale pink in colour, 'semi-spiky' shape and may flower more than once a year. The growth habit is similar to *D. Ellen*.

**(6) Dendrobium Peewee =**

*D. bigibbum* x *D. tetragonum*. This hybrid is midway between its

parents for shape. *D. bigibbum* is dominant for colour with *D. Peewee* ranging from magenta to lilac-purple depending on the parents used. *D. tetragonum* has reduced the number of flowers. As with many primary hybrids, and in fact many hybrids, the size, shape and color of the progeny all depend on the clone that has been used. W. Upton states that in 1980 in a *D. Peewee* he made he used the short pseudobulbous stem form *D. bigibbum* var.*compactum* with a large broadlipped Nthn NSW. form of *D. tetragonum*. The progeny are dominant in *tetragonum* flower shape, except the petal width is greater, and they are dominant in '*compactum*' plant size and flower color.
