### **NEW CLUB TROPHY**

The Garard-Western Hybridising Trophy will be introduced in 2008 and will be awarded at the end of each year and returned at the completion of the year of holding.

There will be 2 trophies,

- one for the pollen parent plant
- and one for the pod parent.

The competition is open to all members of the Club. Plants exhibited must have been bred by members using parent plants owned by members.

This can be done in a number of ways, eg.

- A member might self pollinate a plant they own and if the seedling should win the award then both trophies go to that member.
- Different members might use plants they own to create a seedling (in this case, should they win, then each get the appropriate trophy)

This award will run in conjunction with the normal seedling competition and the same rules apply. The only difference is the showing member/s must own the parent plant/s.

To enter a plant use a green ribbon to signify the plant is to be judged for the Garard-Western trophy. The plant can also have the normal white seedling ribbon to compete in the best seedling competition.

At each monthly meeting the plant winning in this category will be photographed and all monthly winners photos will be judged at the end of the year.

### **GREEN HOUSE HYGIENE**

Members, I feel we are all guilty of sometimes not paying attention to Green House Hygiene, espe-

cially at our busy times of the year.

In the Orchid house we should all clean up old plant material, such as dead leaves and flowers which often in humid environment of a glass house or shade house can cause a breeding ground for fungal disease.

Clean up any litter and empty pots under benches should be removed as they provide housing for slugs, snails and other pests.

Weeds in and around shade house should be removed as they encourage insect pests. Have a programme set up for snails etc. A piece of PVC water pipe with snail bait or ratsak in the centre, and by using this method it protects your pets from eating it.

Blue metal is good for your walk ways and under benches.

**Hygiene rules when potting and dividing.** Sterilize all cutting tools with TRISODIUM. Do not use cutting knives from pot to pot. Sterilize knives etc each time (learn to alternate). Wash your hands with soap and water. Dispose of all plant debris and when using old pots, sterilize thoroughly. Never reuse old potting mix and dispose of it well way from growing area. When you see a plant that may have a virus, put it well away from other plants till you know for sure.

This way you will get the very best from your plants.

### **NATURAL INSECTICIDES**

Here are a few toxic recipes for the nasty bugs

Thank you to OCSA for allowing us to print the article from their magazine. In our Library you will find 'The Good Bug Book'. This is excellent reading.

### **GARLIC SPRAY**

This is for small pests and general plant protection. Chop 90g of raw garlic and soak in 2 table-spoons of paraffin oil for 24 hours. Slowly add 600ml of water into which 7g of soft soap has been dissolved. Stir well, strain through butter muslin and store in a china or glass container, (never use metal). Dilute the solution to one part in 50 to spray affected plants.

### **DERRIS DUST**

This is an organic compound sold commercially that will kill caterpillars if sprinkled on the leaves. Derris is toxic to fish.

### **DIPEL**

This is a commercially made bacteria to be used against caterpillars and cherry slugs and other chewing insects.

### **RHUBARB SPRAY**

This is an excellent insecticide. Cut up 1.5kg rhubarb leaves, boil in 3.5 litres of water, then cool. Dissolve 125g of soft soap in 2.4 litres of hot water. Cool, strain and blend the two liquids.

### **CASUARINA**

Casuarina Needles – up to 9g – infused in a litre of boiling water makes a mild fungicide and protect against fungal and bacteria and mildew problems.

### **INSECT REPELLENT**

Can be made from chopped garlic, onions, lavender leaves and flowers, mint and yarrow mixed together then covered with water. Stand in an airtight container for 24 hours then strain. Add equal quantities of water and a few drops of organic detergent and apply as a spray.

### **CHIVE TEA**

This is effective for scab and mildew fungi. Use about 200g of dried chives (buy in bulk at a health food store) and cover with 600ml of boiling water. Infuse for one hour, and then dilute one part to two of water.

If the above doesn't work, or if they do, it is still useful to get out and look at your plants, and I

mean REALLY look. Pick them up and see if any nasties have left any tracks or traces on them, then set a trap. Get the torch out in the first hour after dark, grab some gloves, your size 9 gumboots and look in the bush house and around.

Then use **TREAD-EM**, **SQUASH –EM** and **CUT-EM-UP**. These I have found over the years to have a rather therapeutic effect on me and have saved a show bench flower of two as well!

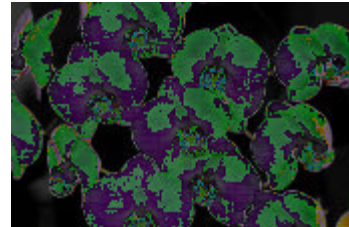

Benched plants

**Best in Open Division and Flower of the Night:**

*Phal.* [Gabriella HCC/AOC x (New Eagle '#1' x Rudi Fischer)] 'Lil' grown by Trevor Garard. The plant carried three inflorescences, the largest having two side branches from the main stem. The shapely well filled in lavender pink 95mm wide and 90mm high flowers had petals slightly paler at the tips which were framed by the sepals. The petals also shaded to cream near the centre of the flower that was complimented by a slightly darker pink labellum.



**Best in First Division:**

*Cym.* Cricket 'Rosetta' benched by Rito Silvestri. This very well presented specimen plant carried over 50 inflorescences arranged evenly around the plant cascading down over the pot and stand. The individual flowers were some 25mm wide and 34mm high, sepals and petals green lightly overlaid light brown and the labelum was deep purple-brown. This primary hybrid between *Cym. devonianum* and the Australian species *Cym. madidum* was registered in 1964.



**Best in Second Division:**

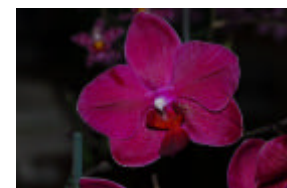
*Sarc.* Judith 'Just Terrific' benched by Judy and Rod McRedmond. Another well grown specimen plant with 12 well displayed inflorescences averaging between 10 – 13 flowers which measured 23mm wide and 21mm high and were well displayed. The filled in flowers had white sepals and petals with heavy red-purple spotting on approximately the one third nearest the flower's centre. The labellum was light yellow with some purple markings on the side-lobes.



**A few other plants benched by members:**

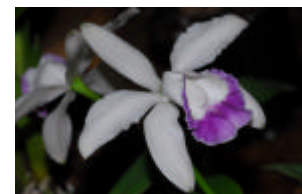
**Open Division.**

*Phal.* Red Onocce grown by Ron and Irene Parish. A well grown moderately sized plant with one spike with two branches emanating from nodes on a previously flowered inflorescence. The plant also had a second inflorescence still in bud. The dark plum flowers were 70mm wide by 65mm high, well filled in with broad petals overlapping the sepals and complimented by a labellum with its mid-lobe coloured darker plum-purple.



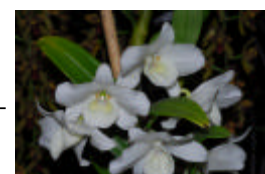
**First Division.**

*C. intermedia* var. *coereulea* x self benched by Suzanne Saunders. This was a very nice varietal form of this species with white sepals and petals and a white labellum with purple mid-lobe. There were two 115mm wide by 120mm high flowers on a single inflorescence and each cane larger than the previous one indicating good cultivation.



**Second Division.**

*Den.* White Pearl benched by Anne and Colin Campbell. A very nice example of a complex hybrid soft cane Dendrobium with six hybrids native to



various regions and counties of Asia in its breeding background. A well grown plant with each year's successive growth larger than the previous year and with inflorescences distributed along several canes each carrying two or three pristine white 70mm wide and high flowers.

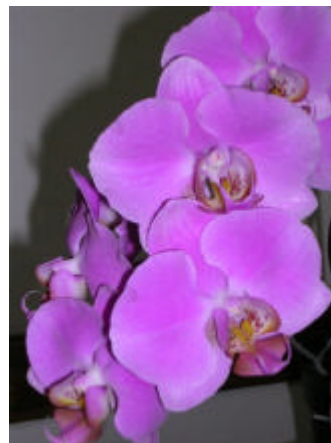

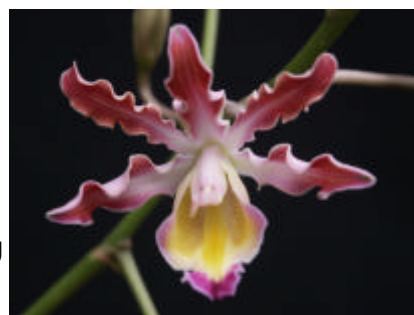


#### SPECIES GROUP

On a very warm evening 18 members met at the Dover Square hall where we were treated, once again, to a magnificent display of species orchids.

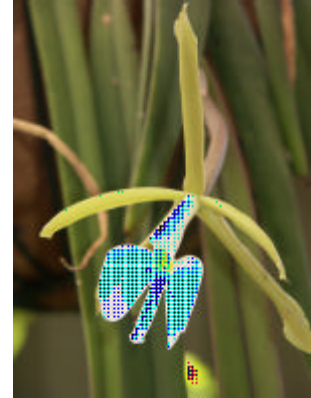
The plant that immediately caught the eye was a very large specimen of *Bifrenaria harrisoniae* a species from Brazil. There are about eleven species in the genus plus several varieties however in this part of the world we only see a couple of them. The plant benched was in a relatively small, conditions they prefer, it displayed 36 ivory white waxy pleasantly perfumed flowers carried in pairs on short 10cm long racemes. The solitary leaves, on clustered pseudobulbs, are leathery, glossy & rather rigid. In cultivation species from this genus are easy to grow and flower. They can withstand bright light and while actively growing should be given as much water and humidity as possible provided the compost is free draining. The other *Bifrenaria* benched was the species *tyrianthina* vegetatively similar to the previous species but more robust with purple-violet flowers thickly hairy and white in the throat not as pleasantly perfumed in my opinion reminiscent of dirty, damp rags.

A species of *Schomburgkia tibicinis* was exhibited with a 2 metre long raceme emanating from a plant with short, rigid leaves atop densely clustered tapering hollow pseudobulbs. Each bulb has a hole at the base that in the wild are inhabited with biting ants. These pseudobulbs, when removed from the orchid and dried, were used by children as a musical flute giving rise to the common name for this species as the mouth flute orchid. It is not a difficult orchid to grow. This genus used is closely related to the genus *Laelia* to which it used to belong and should be cultivated as for that



genus. If contemplating growing Schomburgkias I suggest you obtain a very tall growing area!!

Other species benched were; Cattleya intermedia, Cattleya maxima, Epidendrum elongatum, Epidendrum parkinsonianum, Phaius tankervillea, Octomeria grandiflora, Octomeria gracillus, Sarcochilus hartmanni, Dendrobium loddigesii, Masdevalia ignea, & Coelogyne lactea.

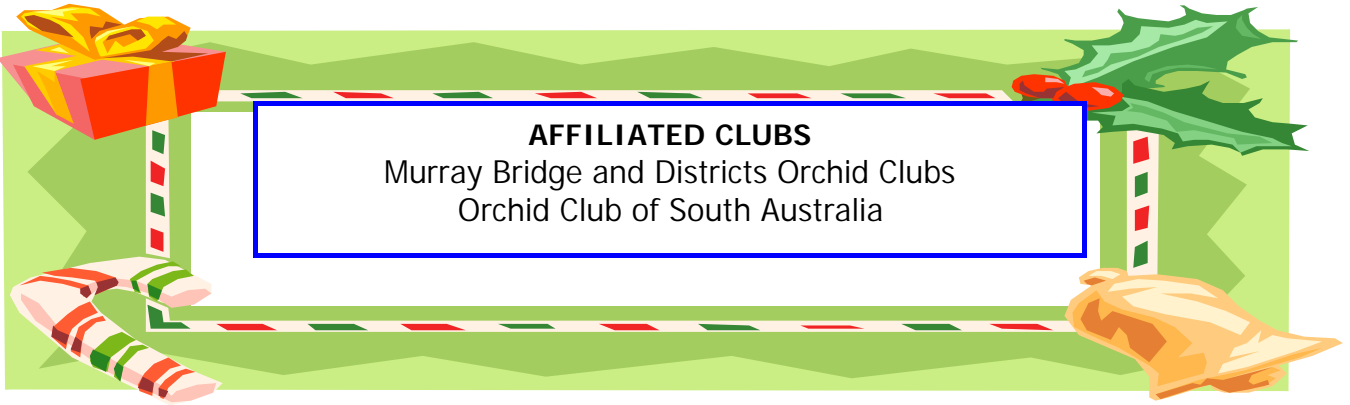
