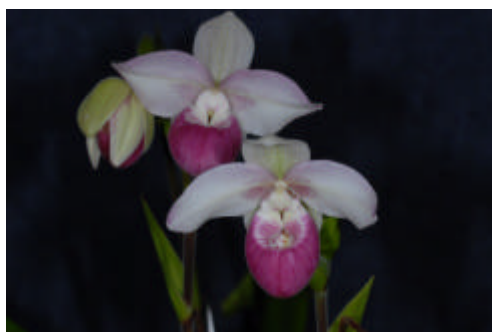
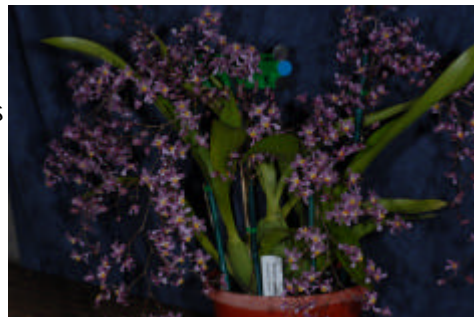

On the Bench at the June 2006 Meeting

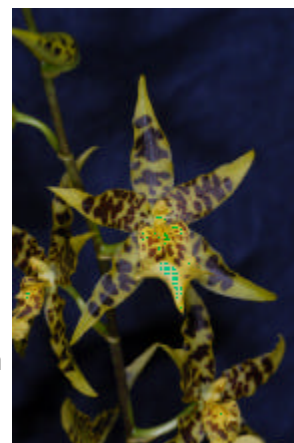
Flower of Open Division and flower of the

night: The species *Oncidium ornithorhynchum* benched by Lucy and Geoff Spear. This plant was quite small but was well grown with two lead growths each producing two arched and branching inflorescences. All flowers on three of these inflorescences were fully open and about 50% of those on the fourth one were still to open. The numerous small light pink flowers made a very attractive display.



Flower of First Division: *Phragmipedium Sedenii*, a primary hybrid between the species *Phrag. longifolium* and *Phrag. schlimii*, benched by Heather Engelhardt. A very nice example of this hybrid, heavily influence by the *Phrag. schlimii* in regards of both the shape of the broad horizontal petals and rounded pouch as well as the white and pink colour of the flowers. The plant was reasonably large with two inflorescences carrying open flowers and at least three more to mature and produce flowers.

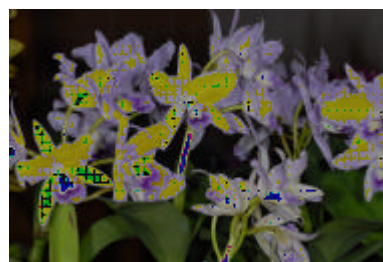
Flower of Second Division: *Maclellanara* Pagan Lovesong benched by Jean Irvine. The man made genus of McIna. Results from hybridization between the three Onciinae genera Brassia, Odontoglossum and Oncidium with one *Brs. species*, one *Onc. sp.* and five *Odm. spp.* making up this particular example. The plant was well grown, filling its pot and producing three inflorescences, one of which was fully out, one with seven of its ten flowers fully open and one still in bud. The attractive flowers were yellow with brown markings.



There were 57 plants on the open bench, 25 in 1st division and 19 in 2nd making a total of over 100 plants making an impressive display on the night. Amongst other plants which caught the eye on the night:

Open Division.

A large plant of *C. Portia* 'Baronessa' benched by Geraldine and Peter Flavel carried 10 inflorescences of up to seven 65 to 75mm wide flowers. Sepals and petals were light lavender in colour and the labellum was white at its base with a large deep purple blotch on its middle lobe and the same pale lavender around its outer edge, all making a very attractive display.



First Division.

A small plant of *Cym. erythrostylum* carrying a single inflorescence with six flowers was benched by Norm Woodend. The white flowers of this species, which is found in the background of many of our white hybrids, had broad white sepals and somewhat narrower petals which protrude forward over the column of the flower. The labellum was white with red markings on the mid-lobe.



Second Division.

Colin and Anne Campbell benched a small well grown plant of *Slc. Dream Cloud* x *Sc. Beaufort*. It carried a single well-shaped and attractive flat 70 x 70mm flower. The sepals were orange-pink colour and the petals were the same base colour with slightly deeper pink shading towards their periphery. The nicely shaped frilled labellum was yellow at the base and deep crimson at its periphery and nicely balanced the flower.

SPECIES GROUP

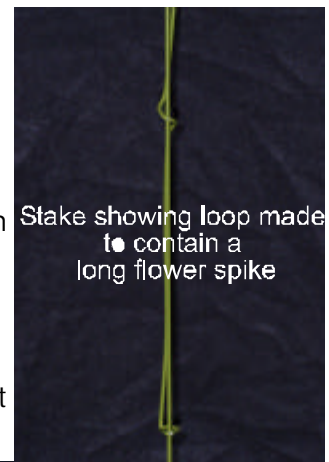
What a species meeting this turned out to be. We had Bill and Jan Miles coming to give us a talk and to bring a great selection of species orchids to look at and purchase. An overwhelming avalanche of trays bearing a grand assortment of plants kept coming through the front door and several trestle tables were set up to display the orchids. Club members were allowed to pick and choose orchids they were interested in and a brisk trade followed.

The actual meeting started 15 minutes later than usual, owing to several avid collectors selecting plants to take home. After the usual opening and dealing with business, Bill started his presentation, having a box on the table in front of him. Pulling out a bundle of green stakes, Bill started explaining how he had made these particular stakes. They were all quite thin metal which he had powder coated and electroplated, and could be bent or twisted in any direction to help hold and encourage growth on orchid spikes.

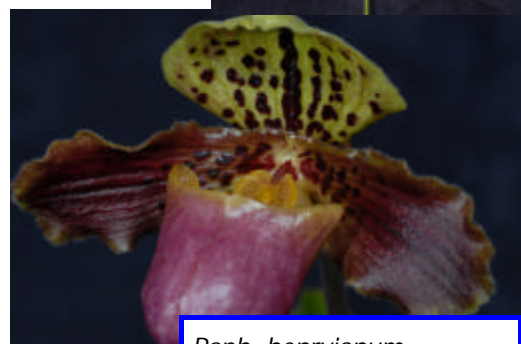
Bill then took up what looked like a slinky toy. Again these were quite thin metal that had been wound into spring shapes. Bill showed how they could be used by pulling and extending them and wrapping the resulting stake around a *Laelia* spike which then stood quite tall and proud.

Next item on Bill's agenda was a fabulous watering wand that could give a really fine spray when watering/misting orchids. It was passed around the table for members to have a good look and Bill even donated on to the Species group to use as a raffle at a later date.

Then came the misting system that Bill and his son use in Victoria. It runs through a solenoid system that can be programmed to mist your orchid collection with the finest mist, enabling orchids to grow in a healthy environment because they are not getting wet enough to encourage fungus or disease. Again, both the solenoid and misting jet was passed around the table for members to look at and ask any questions they might have, about various water pressures needed to make the sys-

tem work adequately.

At about 9.30, Bill was asked to have a look at some of the plants that members had bought along. He picked out an *Oncidium* that was growing on a board and made the comment that this is exactly how the plants grew in South America, especially as the orchids did not grow in pots high up in the trees. He proceeded to look at a few other plants and gave a commentary about them, and then the meeting was declared closed so members could grab a cup of tea / coffee and any more plants that they were interested in. All up, a really great meeting with lots of interaction between speaker and fellow orchid enthusiasts.

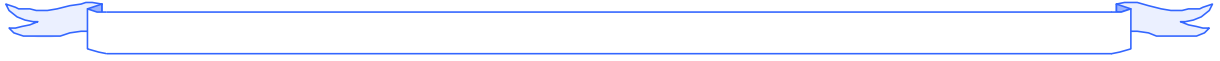
