As temperatures increase, growths and roots of cattleyas are making rapid growth, so water and fertilizer are needed in adequate quantities to keep the new growths making up for quality flowers coming Autumn and Winter. However other cattleyas are flowering now and of course some can be found in flower any month of the year. These need some light rest after flowering, but with Adelaide temperature and usually dry heat, keep the plant at least in a damp state.

One thing to keep in mind is often repotting plants, particularly if large bark pieces are being used, that the plant will dry out almost daily until the bark starts to hold moisture, so water frequently and mist over the plants to prevent as much as possible any leaf shrivel.

If plants are placed on gravel, sand or shellgrit etc. this material can be kept damp which helps to add the necessary extra humidity under the leaves.

Plants that are hung up are of course more susceptible to drying out more quickly as temperatures climb. Once again don't drown the plants, but under Adelaide Plains' conditions a reasonable amount of water can be given during summer irrespective of where they are being grown.

As a word of warning, mealy bug will sometimes get into the new growths, so watch out for these pests, when sighted take the required action to clean them out.

CULTURAL NOTES FOR CYMBIDIUMS MONTH OF NOVEMBER

Cymbidium culture this month differs little from that of last month. The main objective is to keep those new growths moving along, this is best achieved by seeing that the compost never dries right out, but especially these warmer days it is better to keep the compost moist. Use a balanced fertilizer with a high nitrogen ratio, use the fertilizer, when a foliar one, in a weaker proportion than suggested but more frequently ($\frac{1}{2}$ strength weekly rather than full strength fortnightly).

Take the necessary precaution to keep those troublesome pest down, often it is easier to take precaution rather than eradicate.

CULTURAL NOTES FOR NOVEMBER FOR AUSTRALIAN EPIPHYTICS

The orchids should be growing away now, making new roots and showing the first signs of new growths, be careful with watering until these growths reach a length of about 10cm and have hardened off a little otherwise they will rot quite quickly due to water settling in the top of the new growth where developing leaves form a little cup.

You can start fertilizing with nitrogen based fertilizer this month but gently does it, use half recommended strength once a week rather than full strength once a fortnight.
