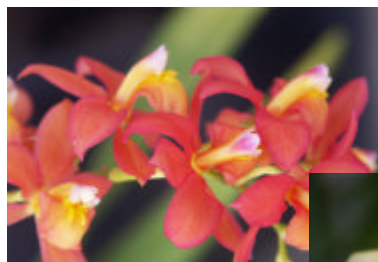
Sunday 6 Feb saw a great afternoon and B-B-Que with 28 people attending.

Although it was a hot day everyone enjoyed

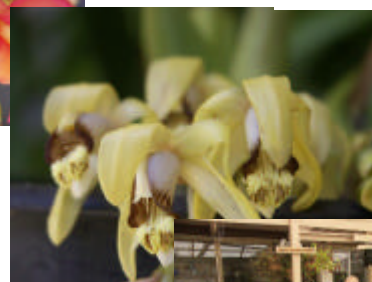
the great community spirit. We also took the occasion to launch details of our wine and glass commemorative souvenirs.

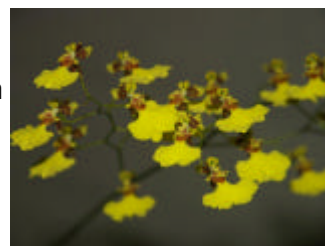

OUR TRIP TO VICTOR HARBOR

Sunday 30th January 2005, our Patron and his wife plus six Committee members visited Victor Harbor start an Club group, we were very well received. 29 people attended and 15 became members on the day, 11 other people who could not attend will be at our April meeting. Pat and Jack Lewis were members of our Club many years ago, now live at Goolwa, they have now rejoined.



March meeting will be a fun learning time with Geoff and Graham (prop of Valley Orchids) They are experienced in running orchid workshops, both men are experts in growing Cymbidiums. Graham and Linda his wife have just become grandparents. Congratulations.

Our first meeting of the southern branch

Flower of the Night, *Cattleya* Penny Kuroda 'Spots' grown by Bev and John Gay, came from the Open Division bench. A well grown plant having 11 mature growths and one new lead. Two of the mature growths had spikes, one with 10 well displayed flowers, the other with nine. The flowers, 68mm wide and 90mm long, had cream sepals with dark purple spotting and purple petals which became much paler near the centre of the flower. The mid-lobe of the labellum was deep purple. Congratulations Bev and John.

The hybrid *C. Penny Kuroda* is a cross between the species *C. guttata* and *C. Summer Snow* registered in 1976. *C. guttata* has dark purple spotting on its sepals and petals and the small mid-lobe of its labellum is rose-purple. The larger labellum and the more solidly coloured petals are the result of influences by species in the background of the other parent.

Another plant of interest on the Open bench was *Phragmipedium* Praying Mantis, a primary hybrid between the species *Phrag. longifolium* and *Phrag. boissierianum*. Benched by Geraldine and Peter Flavel, it had four mature growths, three of which had inflorescences and there were five new leads. This plant is a progressive flowerer. There were two flowers on the one inflorescence and one on each of the others. The flowers were very attractive with green pouch, green sepals with pale pinkish brown striping and long nearly horizontal twisted pale green petals overlaid light pinkish brown.

Another plant of interest on the Open bench was *Phragmipedium* Praying Mantis, a primary hybrid between the species *Phrag. longifolium* and *Phrag. boissierianum*. Benched by Geraldine and Peter Flavel, it had four mature growths, three of which had inflorescences and there were five new leads. This plant is a progressive flowerer. There were two flowers on the one inflorescence and one on each of the others. The flowers were very attractive with green pouch, green sepals with pale pinkish brown striping and long nearly horizontal twisted pale green petals overlaid light pinkish brown.

Onc. Sharry Baby 'Sweet Fragrance', benched by Terri Rees, was a large plant with two attractive branching inflorescences. The sepals and petals of the flowers were deep magenta and the large labellum was white giving the impression of a 'dancing lady'. The flowers are complemented by a very attractive fragrance.

Des and Hazel Alsop benched the species *Onc. flexuosum* growing on cork bark. It had five mature growths, the lead growth having one attractive branching spike. Another 'dancing lady' with small yellow dorsal sepal and petals having heavy deep brown barring, the large bright yellow labellum forming the 'skirt'.
