This plant was 2 meters tall and 3 Meters wide with around 31,000 flowers and 179 buds on 400 inflorescences.

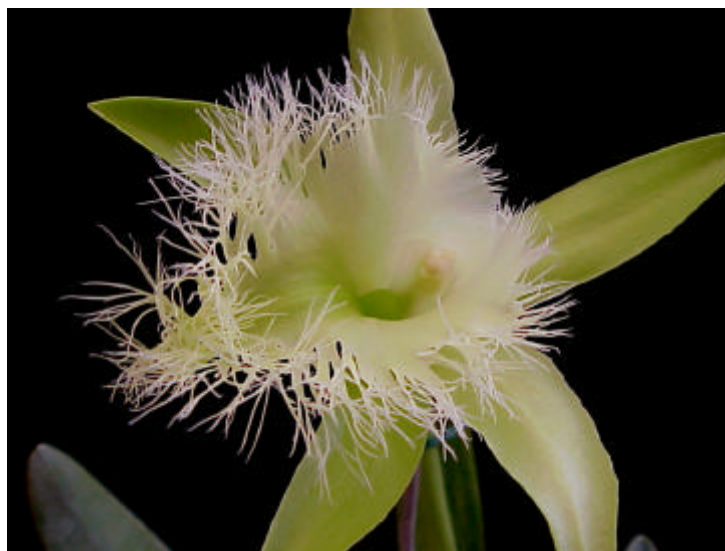

Brassavola digbyana 'Mrs. Chase'
(Also known as Rhyncholaelia)

This species is found between Mexico to the Honduras

It will grow well with the Cattleyas
And for me (once the plant established) has flowered occasionally twice a year.
Flowers are up to 75mm across and the plant is noted for its feathery appearance.



Note on our Speaker for this month—Stephen Monkhouse

Stephen started growing orchids as a job with little real interest in the blooms themselves. A job that was simple to obtain as he started working for my parents. He did attend a number of courses during his apprenticeship obtaining and also gaining more information plus a interest for orchids. Cymbidiums were the main orchid that they grew so these were the first he liked, but gradually developed an interest in Paphiopedilums.

At that time the development in Zygopetalums was not even a wild thought. it didn't take long before Stephen became more involved with the orchid industry as the family business grew, developing a new nursery site at O'Halloran Hill. He studied the judging course and became a qualified AOC orchid judge during which time He held that position for some 13-15 years before semi-retiring from the position. His interests have now changed to the exotic Zygopetalum that he breed for today and tomorrows markets. Cymbidiums are no longer grown but he still maintains & grows Paphiopedilums. The main crop is the Zygopetalums for sale on the world wide market.

If the club moves to St. Marys it will effectively leave the current area without a local club. I know that currently our subscription paying members are equally divided between those south of O'Halloran Hill and the "plains" people to the north but is a move to possibly gain more members, at the expense of others, sufficient reason to relocate?

I trust there will be some good debate before the final commitment to move is undertaken and I plan to continue to support the club albeit in a reduced roll should the members vote to make the move to St Marys.

Presidents Report

Last months meeting was a very full on event with 4 speakers discussing 5 topics of orchid interest. 42 members were present. Benching was limited as would be expected at this time of the year, however many good quality plants were shown. It is hoped that we can get more exhibitors in second & first divisions.

DAYTIME MEETING REPORT.

We had 19 members and visitors at the Daytime meeting and our guest speaker for the day was Graeme Hazeldine. Graeme and his wife Maureen grow mainly Cymbidiums and have produced lots of Champion orchids at various shows, as we saw from the slides, several of which were actually taken at shows.

Graeme gave an extremely informative talk on how he and Maureen grow their cyms. He included a number of tips on growing such as, to keep the flowers above the foliage, they put a long bamboo stake into the pot and attach a piece of thin elastic to the inflorescence about the second or third bud from the top and then attach the other end to the top of the stake with a clothes peg. This actually elongates the inflorescence enough to bring the flowers clear of the leaves. He also mentioned the importance of properly preparing and presenting your orchids for the shows. As this is the topic for next months' day meeting, the comment was very timely. The meeting closed with afternoon tea and lots of questions for Graeme.

Open Division

Flower of the Division and Flower of the Night ***Ctsm. Susan Fuchs 'Burgundy Chips' grown By A. & R.*** ***Herrmann –M^cKay***

The flowers on this plant were very striking being yellow heavily spotted all over with deep burgundy spots. These 5 flowers on a single inflorescence were quite large at 100mm wide by 80mm long with a huge lip of 65 x 45mm. The spike came from the base of a new growth with 3 other leafless back bulbs.

This plant of 10 bulbs had 2 inflorescences each with 3 flowers measuring 60mm x 60mm. The sepals and petals were yellow with light brown spotting / barring and a relatively large, contrasting white lip with a purple centre

A beautiful branching inflorescence bearing 80 pale yellow, white lipped flowers with tiny brown barred sepals and petals came from a plant of 3 pseudobulbs and a new growth. The plant was attached to a cork slab and growing out of a 12cm pot. *Onc. flexuosum* tends to grow vertically
