THIS MONTHS PROFILE IS ON RON PARISH.

Ron started growing Orchids in 1978, after a trip to Queensland, and after seeing a South Coast Orchid Club Show at Marion,. Ron grows mainly Paphs, he has a mixed collection, with approx 70 species, and 10 - 15 varieties of species.

Ron maintains you need never stop experimenting, trying different heating and cooling temperature.

Apart from the Orchids, Ron runs a Video Recording Business, he started the Business in 1983, you saw some of his work at our last Cultural Meeting, when Ron showed a video recording of the Club's Winter Show.

He is also putting a video together about Spefies Paphs, this has been his project over the last 3 years.

If you wish for a copy on the Winter Show Video.

The Spring Show is fast approaching so it may well be appropriate to give a couple of tips :-

1. Make sure that your plant is well presented to the Judges, the leaves nicely cleaned with a mixture of equal parts milk and water. Die back on the tips removed, do not cut straight across the leaf but try and give a natural look by pointing the leaf. The judges do not look favourably at minis or Intermediates where the foliage has been cropped.
2. Make sure that your pots have your exhibitor number on them, this can either be put on with a water resistant pen on a piece of masking tape or a more permanent method is to use one of the silver or gold pens.
3. The day before the put-in make sure that ALL your plants that you will be using for the exhibit have a good drink, this lets the surplus drain and not make a mess in your car, also the plants have to go a week before they can be given another soaking.
4. Staking of spikes, do not over stake (anatural presentation will often score higher) tying is permitted above the bottom flower but only do this where necessary or where it is required to transport the plant. Never leave the stake protruding above the top flower. Where possible place the stake to hide it as much as possible. Green bamboo stakes have a better appearance when used, however the use of metal stakes is permissible (These can be covered with the green tape that florist use)
5. Make sure that you have the correct Exhibitor number, if in doubt check with the Show Marshall at the next Cultural Meeting.
6. On the day of the Show make sure that you take with you empty pots, these are used to raise plants in your exhibit, Twisty tie, a pair of secateurs, water resistant pen, and a broom & dustpan to cleanup after you have finished.
7. When making out labels, make sure that correct color is used and print as large as to fill the whole label

Using a double sided tape place the label on a conspicuous leaf near the flower.

8. Always exhibit your most hopefull plants of wining prizes to the front never where the Judge has to climb in for a look.
9. Make out a check list for future use.

Trading Table:- Shows & Monthly Meetings.

At the recent Committee meeting your Committee after a geat deal of discussion has made the following rule.

'Should a member put any plants on a trading table it is the sole responsibility of the member to see that his plants are priced to sell. The past practice of price reducing to sell is to cease and will not be permitted.

So if you do not wish to take plants home please see that they are

1. Priced according to the standard of the plant being offered.
2. See that the plants are of the required standard.

One of the easiest Paphiopedilums to grow, and one which, when specimen size, is quite spectacular, is *Paph. insgne*.

At the August Cultural Meeting, Mr. Lawrie Chambers, exhibited a plant in 1st Division, with 15 spikes, and it was indeed a beautiful sight.

Paph. insgne belongs to the Otopedilum group, which comprises the largest of the sub-genera in the genus Paphispedilum, and includes those species most commonly found in cultururation such as *Paph. angus*, *Paph ballatum*, *Paph. callosum*, *Paph. fainieanum*, *Paph. spicereanum*. *Paph. sukhakulu* and *Paph venustum*.

The distinguishing features of the Otopedilum sub-genies include a pouch possessing conspicuous ears (auricles) and petals which are elongate. Their geographic distrubution, habitat, flower form, leaf colour, and overall plant habit varies greatly.

Paph. insgne is found in the Himalayan regions of Assim and India. Plants grow in valleys, on calcareous rocks with a southern exposure, and are subjected to the full force of the monsoon rains. They have rather long narrow, droopy leaves, of a medium green colour, the flowers are borne singly, on a tall peduncle, and measure up to 12½ cms across. The flowers vary considerably in colour, the dorsal sepal is broad and oval, with the lateral margins slightly rolled back, and hooded. The dorsal is green with white margins, and with numeral purple brown spots, in a pattern longitudually. The ventual sepal is small, terminating in a point, and pale green in colour. The petals are wavy at the edges, and ablong in shape. Their colour is yellowish green with purple-brown long itudural veins, the pouch is yellowish-green shaded brown, the lobes a deep brownish yellow. There are many named varities of *Paph. insgne* mostly based on colour variation. Those most commonly cultivated are *Paph insgne* var. *Sanderæ*, and *Paph. insigne* var. *Harefield Hall*. Var. *Harefield Hall* is a very large form, with a dorsal sepal of pale yellowish green, heavy spotted with chocolate brown and with a wide pure white margin. The flowers of var. *Sanderæ* are almost noncolour yellow, except for the white margin of the dorsal sepal, and tiny brown dots at the base of the dorsal sepal.

Paph. insgne which flowers in winter, can be grown successfully in a shade-house, but like all Paphiopedilums does appreciate the little extra warmth when grown in a cool glasshouse during the cold winter months. Paphiopedilums grow well in plastic pots, and prefer a well aerated sompost. They do not appreciate water lying around the roots, and care should be taken when watering to make sure water does not remain in the leaf axil, as this can lead to notting and subsequent loss of growths. Do not overpot plants, as they do not grow vigorous root systems, and the compost will dry out more quickly. Paphiopedilums can be foliar fed, and a weak fertilizer solution applied every 2 weeks during growing period is suitable. They like humidity, but also the growing area should be well ventilated.

Paph. insgne is one of the easiest paphiopedilums to obtain as well as grow. I recommend it to all those who have not had the pleasure.

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Our registrar of judges Mrs Brenda Lynch is looking for helpers, for the Spring Show..For the judging on the Sunday morning September 20th. 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GROWING TEMPERATURES

The following is an approximate guide to suggested growing temperatures for various orchid genera. Temperatures shown are ideal minimum night temperatures. Maximum day temperatures will depend on air movement and humidity available, but as a rough guide allow temperatures to rise no more than 10°C above the maximum of the range for more than the occasional day.

COLD GROWERS (Below 10°C)

Southern native Australian terrestrials and some epiphytes.

However, some cool growers, e.g. Cymbidiums, will tolerate low temperatures for an extended period. Others, even intermediate growers, will suffer periodic drops in temperature below 10°C. These drops will be less harmful if plants are kept a little on the dry side. We have even grown Phalaenopsis in the cold dry air with minimum temperatures down to around 8°C this way.

Of course, with any plant, ideal culture is obtained by following closely the conditions of its natural habitat.

COOL GROWERS 10 - 15 °C (50 - 60 °F)

Cymbidiums, most Lycastes, Odontoglossums and Odontiodas, soft-cane Dendrobiums, green-leafed Paphiopedilums, Australian Dendrobiums and Sarcocylus, Zygopetalums, Sophronitis, cooler growing Laelias and Cattleyas.

INTERMEDIATE GROWERS 15 - 20 °C (60 - 70 °F)

Tropical Cymbidiums, the few warmer growing Lycastes, Brazilian Miltonias, mottled-leaf Paphiopedilums, many intergeneric Odontoglossum types, some Vandas and sub-tropical Dendrobiums, Cattleyas and Cattleya intergenerics.

WARM GROWERS 20 - 25 °C (70 - 80 °F)

Hard-cane Dendrobiums, many Vandas, Phalaenopsis.
