ACTIVITY ASSOCIATED WITH BOTH WINTER AND SPRING SHOWS.

1981 UNITED NATIONS INTERNATIONAL YEAR OF DISABLED PERSONS

An Economy size sarlon shadehouse, benching and plants will be on display at both shows. Ticket selling will commence in July and 'South Coast' members will be given the opportunity to both purchase and sell tickets. There is a lot of interest in this project and to all donors of plants we express our thanks.

SPECIAL DISPLAYS AT BOTH WINTER AND SPRING SHOWS.

Consideration is being given to featuring at both shows a specialexhibit arranged on the 'shapes' available at Colonnades and supported with limited greenery, cymbidium plants which will convey to the general public and orchid lovers an appreciation of the hybridists contribution to introducing new cultivars within the genus 'cymbidium.' The Club will arrange for each plant exhibited to have a special card bearing the collective (grex) name, cultivar epithet, the year of registra tion and the name of the hybridist. As examples at the Spring Show we could have: - Swallow 1916 Sanden; Burgundian 1955 Schroden; In the case of species the card would be say:-Lowianum Mid 1800 Locality Burma. We would also like to have:-1. Plants of the same collective name but having differentcultivar epithets. e.g. San Francisco 'Meadow Mist'; S.F 'The Beat' 2. Plants which have been converted to tettraploid and which can be placed alongside a similar plant not converted. All plants so exhibited will be eligible for a prize and members who feel that they can assist in enetering plants are requested to write the names of the plants on the reverse side of the sheet for the Winter Show. Members DO NOT have to provide the year of registration etc. Remember Swallows, Samarkands and the like all contribute.

SPECIAL DISPLAY AT WINTER SHOW ONLY MINIATURE CYMBIDIUMS.

The rules of judging provide that in judging miniatures THE PLANT IS TO BE JUDGED. All miniatures will be displayed as a group and to avoid confusion Novelty Cymbidiums will be in the same area. Please make a special effort to make this stand outstanding.

- 1. All exhibitors must be financial members of the South Coast Orchid Club of South Australia Inc.
- 2. Entries are free
- 3. Exhibitors are bound by the Constitution, Rules and By-Laws and Special Show Rules of the South Coast Orchid Club of South Australia Inc.
- 4. The opinion of the Judges is final and binding and no objections or discussions regarding results will be considered with the one exception of an infringement by an Exhibitor of any of the Club's Laws, By*Iaws or Show Rules. Any objection in this case must be lodged in writing with the Club Secretary.
- 5. The Club accepts no responsibility for any loss, damage or infection suffered by any plant or blooms exhibited.
- 6. The Club reserves the right to photograph any of the exhibits if it should so wish.
- 7. In all matters regarding the arrangement and conducting of the Show (with the exception of judging) the Show Marshall/Show Secretary is the ruling authority.
- 8. No plants suspected by the Club Virus Adjudicators of being infected with virus will be eligible for competition and such plants will be completely isolated from all other plants.
- 9. The exhibition areas will be closed during judging. No exhibitors, public, or members other than the Show Marshall/Show Secretary, Judges of the Club and Associate Judges will be allowed to remain in the exhibition area during this period.
- 10. Non-exhibitors are requested not to congregate in the exhibition area prior to judging.so that officials can arrange plants and perform other necessary duties unhindered.

LABELLING OF PLANTS.

At both Shows plants must be labelled with the coloured labels provided by the Club with the exhibitors number and the name of the plant. Supply of these labels can be obtained from the Show Secretary.
