WINTER SHOW.

Members are reminded of this Show - benching of plants on Saturday 17
July by 4 p m. Judging will commence at 5 pm and the exhibition areas
will be closed to all but Judging officials. Entrance for bringing in
plants - the ramp to the loading bay. It is a general rule that all
plants being exhibited shall have been the property of the member for a
period in excess of six (6) months.

Trading table at Winter Show. All plants offered for sale shall carry
the members number painted on the pot, an appropriate label which shall
give the flowering color and time of flowering. All plants shall be
firmly established and acceptably potted up. Struck back bulbs will not
be accepted unless they are in a reasonable container and again well potted.
At the conclusion of the Show it will be the responsibility of the member
to ascertain whether all their plants have been sold and no responsibility
will be accepted for unclaimed plants.

SHOW RULES

The Show Rules as applicable to the Winter Show shall apply to the Spring Show. Members who have insufficient plants to enable them to arrange their own display will be able to place them in a Composite display. The purpose of Composite displays is to provide for the needs of such members and these displays will be arranged in two sections - one for 1st Division and the other for 2nd Division.

There is a distinct need to encourage members with collections not so small and yet not so large to either to organize their own 'mini-display' or to arrange such a display with another member/s. Every assistance as to area, advice etc will be afforded and it is to be hoped that this facility will be accepted by many members. The Show Secretary is available at all Club meetings to discuss this matter or may be contacted at his home address on telephone 271-7070, both day and night.

Many members are hesitant either to exhibit their plants or to become involved in display activity. The reason is generally 'Oh I am not good enough'. None of us were 'good enough' initially so why worry? And how many times have you gone home and regretted not benching at a monthly meeting that plant which you left in the shadehouse? Enjoy the pleasure of fraternising with the other exhibitors and feel the satisfaction of having exhibited - of telling your friends and relations that you participated. You may not feel up to supporting the theme in a 'mini-display' - certainly it would be difficult - but then you are excused. So you do not want to be bothered with moss. Fair enough - well we hope to be able to make bark available.
