Constitution Amendment:

In accordance with the Constitution of the South Coast Orchid Club of South Australia Incorporated, Clause 26, notice is hereby given that it is the intention of the Committee to present the following amendment to the Club's Constitution to the Members for their vote to be cast at the February 1988 meeting of the Club.

Members are asked to collect their ballot papers from the issuing officer and to place the completed paper in the box provided.

(Honorary Members and Junior Members are not eligible to vote.)

The following to be deleted from and added to the end of Clause 11(a) of the Constitution of the South Coast Orchid Club of South Australia Incorporated:-

Delete- Second line the words 'ex officio'

Add at the end of Clause 11(a) -

'The Immediate Past President shall be a Member of the Management Committee and entitled to full voting rights until such time as he ceases to become the Immediate Past President, or until the conclusion of the next Annual General Meeting after first becoming Immediate Past President, which ever of these events be the earlier.'

These alterations are recommended to you for your consideration by your Committee, to make these alterations will ensure that our Constitution remains in line with that of the Orchid Club of South Australia Inc. on whose constitution ours' is based, as this alteration was passed by its members at their November meeting.

A slash mark should separate the award for the awarding society :- AM/NSW, AD/TASM, FCC/VIC.

In the event of two awards from one society, or two or more societies granting the same award, it is recommended they be linked by a hypen such as :- AM-AD/NSW, AM/AOC-VIC.

NOMENCLATURE

The Australian Orchid Council urges standardisation of nomenclature in accordance with interational rules and the International Orchid Commission Handbook on Orchid Nomenclature and Registration.

CORRECT WRITING OF ORCHID NAMES.

Species and their variants.

Each species has a generic name, or first term, e.g. Cattleya, also a specific epithet, or second term, e.g. skinneri. The two terms together constitute the specific name of the species: Cattley skinneri

When written they are always in italics or underline. The generic name begins with a capital letter but the specific epithet (second term) is written with a small first letter even when it is derived from a personal name.

A varietal epithet (third term) is given to a distinctive race within a species, it is preceded by the abbreviation var. (for variety) in roman letters, and is in italics or underlined and without a captial. Example: cymbidium lowianum var, concolor.

A special clone of a species may be given a cultivar epithet (third of fourth term). It is not latinised, as a capital, is not in italics, is not underlined, and has signle quotes. Examples: Cattley skinneri 'mistral' (third term) and Cymbidium lowianum var, concolor 'Picardy' (fourth term).

Artificial Hybrids.

The generic name (first term) beings with a capital letter and is in italics or underlined. The second term is always a registered hybrid name. It is not latinised, is in roman letters, and the initial letter is a capital. Example: Cymbidium Highland Mist.

A special clone of a hyrid may be distinguished by a cultivar epithet. It is in roman letters, has a capital, and is in single quotes. Example: Cymbidium Highland Mist 'Dillabirra'
